


Supporting the AU Malabo Commitments

Launched in 2012, The New Alliance for Food Security and Nutrition (also called the New Alliance) is a shared commitment to achieve sustained and inclusive agriculture-led growth in Africa. The New Alliance supports the goals of the 2014 African Union (AU) Malabo Declaration on Accelerated Agricultural Growth and Transformation for Shared Prosperity and Improved Livelihoods, as well as the commitments of AU Agenda 2063.

The New Alliance will contribute to the broader CAADP mutual accountability processes as part of the Country Agriculture Joint Sector Reviews (JSR) and the Malabo Biennial reporting process.



A New Model of Partnership

The New Alliance for Food Security and Nutrition is a partnership that brings together the capacities and interests of diverse stakeholders, including African governments and institutions, the private sector, civil society, research institutions, donors, and other development partners to address key constraints to inclusive, agriculture-led growth in Africa.

African governments have committed to develop or revise policies that will facilitate responsible private investment in agriculture in support of smallholders, including women. As part of the New Alliance, private sector companies have also committed through Letters of Intent. Development partners have committed to predictable funding levels directly aligned with countries' National Agriculture Investment Plans (NAIPs).

Dialogue and consultation with civil society and farmers' organizations is strongly encouraged to strengthen accountability and advocate for effective public policy to advance New Alliance principles and goals.

Transforming African Agriculture

Public and private partners in the New Alliance are committed to policy changes that bolster Africa's leadership and support the implementation of country plans and policies that will improve food security and nutrition. Designed to unlock the potential of the NAIPs, the New Alliance supports a country-driven approach to development, with input and collaboration from local organizations and leaders.
